What happens at the study visits?

After an initial visit to confirm that this study is suitable ('screening' visit), there will be 26 visits where the study team will administer the intravenous infusion ('IV' or 'drip') and monitor your loved one's health and condition.

On the day of these infusions, we'll also conduct some health assessments:

- Urine pregnancy test (for women of childbearing potential only)
- Other urine tests
- Blood tests
- Vital signs (e.g. pulse rate, weight and blood pressure)
- Monitoring for any potential side effects
- The study team will record details of any other medication the participant may be taking



Other study-related assessments, such as MRI scans, PET scans, spinal fluid sampling* and questionnaires, will be conducted less often - or not at all - depending on your clinic's facilities. For example, if a participant has a PET scan they will not have spinal fluid sampling, and vice versa.

The questionnaires are for you both to complete regarding your loved one's memory and behavior, how they are getting on with daily activities and their moods.

You will be provided with a full study visit schedule, so that you can both see exactly what will happen at each visit. It is vital that your loved one makes every effort to attend all visits, however if for any reason they are unable to attend please contact the study team to rearrange the visit.

*MRI scans involve the participant lying inside a machine while the study team takes pictures of the brain which will then be examined by a specialist. PET scans similarly take a picture of the brain. Spinal fluid sampling (or 'lumbar puncture') involves taking a small amount of fluid from the lower spine with a needle.
