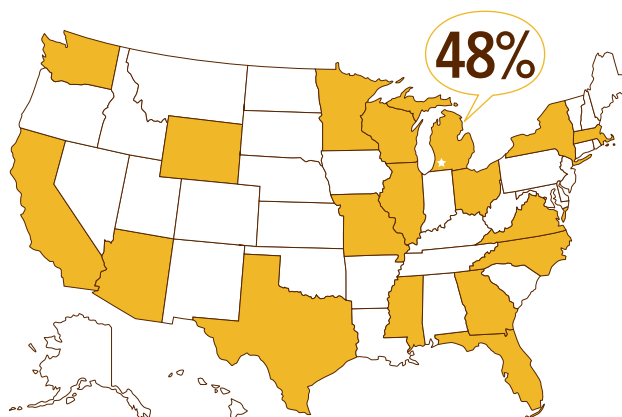

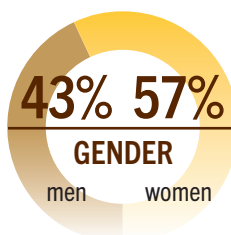

As a private medical school, our class represents 18 different states.



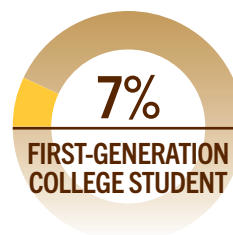
AVERAGE AGE

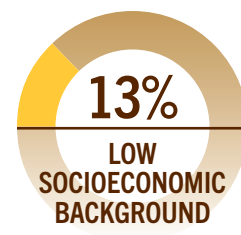
